

2. Property Appearance

a. Description of General Area (Describe neighborhood, historic district, land use & direct or indirect effect upon other building of historic interest. If more space is needed, attach additional sheets.)

On one of Weymouth's main traffic routes, the Post Office is located in an area of smallscale commercial strip development. Nearby building uses include gas station, funeral home, bowling alley, donut shop and storefront retail.

b. General Condition of Property (Site and Building)

Building is in good condition, grounds appear somewhat unkempt. The granite front stair is in need of re-pointing, as is some of the jointing on the main building near grade level.

c. Description of Building Material (Roofs, walls, foundation, interior features, floor and ceiling, etc.)

Random ashlar granite walls are capped by a wood cornice and end gables. The slate roof features a wood and metal louvered belfry. Multi-paned double hung windows, trim and entrance surround are wood. The lobby has a simple terrazzo floor, marble wainscot with wood panelling above and simple plaster walls.

A small flight of granite steps leads to the center entrance and through an interior wood and glass vestibule to the rectangular lobby. The Postmaster's Office is at the right end, the service screen is to the rear, behind which is the workroom with mail vestibule and platform beyond.

4. Architectural Significance

Identify type, period, method of construction, artistic value, significant and distinguishable entity (See National Register criteria, 36 CFR 60.4, Oriteria for Evaluation). The basic 5-bay facade is subdivided into a central 3-bay entrance section with flanking single bays, by the use of slightly projecting simple pilasters. A wood denticulated cornice surrounds the building, changing plane above the flat pilasters. Recessed panels extend below the windows down to the slightly projecting ashlar base. The wood entrance, in a segmental arched opening, contains simple quartered pilasters and engaged Doric columns supporting a simple denticulated frieze. A Georgian Revival fanlite appears over the replacement aluminum entrance doors. The segmental arch panel contains an eagle in bas-relief with outspread wings. A louvered belfry with chamfered corners and metal cupola perches on the gable roof ridge.

Of a simple design(seen in other towns in brick), this Post Office is unique in its use of local granite for the exterior. Otherwise, it is a design which was repeated many timesalate product of the Depression years and Post Office building programs.

6. Conclusion and Recommendation

The Post Office's uniqueness and special interest lies in the use of an uncommon material, granite, used on a common building type. This change in material greatly changes the character of an otherwise ordinary building. It, however, does not, as of this date, fulfill the 50 year old requirement of the National Register. 


- 1. LOBBY

- 5. MAIL PLATFORM


ORIGINAL BUILDING (BEFORE ADDITION)





