At a public hearing on 10/16/2019 the Board of Zoning Appeals;

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TO GRANT A SPECIAL PERMIT under Section 120-40 of the Weymouth Zoning Ordinance to build an addition onto an existing single family home in the R-1 District. The project will enclose an existing three season room and add a full second floor above per a Plot Plan created by Evanson Browne, dated August 19, 2019 and per architectural plans prepared by McKinnon and Associates, dated July 30, 2019.

FINDINGS:

The Board found that the proposal met the requirements for a Special Permit under Section 120-122 (D) as follows:

- 1. The specific site is an appropriate location for such a use. *This is an existing residential neighborhood where numerous homes have previously performed the same conversion.*
- 2. The proposed use or structure will not be detrimental or adversely affect the character or future character of the neighborhood or town. *None of the existing nonconformities will be extended.*
- 3. There is not a potential for nuisance or serious hazard to vehicles or pedestrians. *There will be no change to off street parking availability.*

- 4. There are adequate and appropriate facilities, utilities and other public services provided for the proper operation of the proposed use. *The project will require full review and approval from Weymouth Engineering and DPW Divisions*.
- 5. That the public convenience and welfare will be substantially served with the proposal. The project will create additional living space for the family, increasing the value of the home and tax revenue for the Town.

CONDITIONS:

No additional conditions were placed on the approval.

Under MGL Chapter 40A, Section 11, the approval of the Board of Zoning Appeals will NOT take effect until it has been recorded in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds.

After the twenty (20) day appeal period has passed, the Town Clerk will send to the petitioner: (1) the certificate that no appeal was filed, (2) the certificate of granting of variance and/or special permit. The petitioner shall record these documents with the Norfolk Registry of Deeds, Dedham, MA, with the appropriate filing fee.

When a receipt from the Registry of Deeds is presented to the Building Inspector (to show that the decision has been recorded), the proper permit will be issued.
