At a public hearing on 4/13/2021 the Board of Zoning Appeals;

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TO GRANT SPECIAL PERMITS under Weymouth Zoning Ordinance Sections 120-40 (Extension or Change by Special Permit) to add a new entryway/mudroom to 192 North St. as shown on a survey prepared by Maloney Geospatial and dated 7/13/2011.

FINDINGS:

The Board found that the proposal met the requirements for a Special Permit under Section 120-122 (D) as follows:

- The specific site is an appropriate location for such a use. This is a legally preexisting 1. tow-family in an R-1 residential district. The proposal aims to mirror the addition previously added to the opposite side to provide additional living space within the unit.
- The proposed use or structure will not be detrimental or adversely affect the character or 2. future character of the neighborhood or town. Balancing the façades of the two side by side units will enhance the curb appeal of the property.

- 3. There is not a potential for nuisance or serious hazard to vehicles or pedestrians.

 Adequate off- street parking is provided. There is no change to the number of units.
- 4. There are adequate and appropriate facilities, utilities and other public services provided for the proper operation of the proposed use. All work will be done in conformance with Town of Weymouth Building Code and under the supervision of the Department of Public Works and the Weymouth Conservation Commission.
- 5. That the public convenience and welfare will be substantially served with the proposal. *The addition is in keeping with the character of the neighborhood and architecturally balances the façade.*

CONDITIONS:

None.

Under MGL Chapter 40A, Section 11, the approval of the Board of Zoning Appeals will NOT take effect until it has been recorded in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds.

After the twenty (20) day appeal period has passed, the Town Clerk will send to the petitioner: (1) the certificate that no appeal was filed, (2) the certificate of granting of variance and/or special permit. The petitioner shall record these documents with the Norfolk Registry of Deeds, Dedham, MA, with the appropriate filing fee.

When a receipt from the Registry of Deeds is presented to the Building Inspector (to show that the decision has been recorded), the proper permit will be issued.
