At a public hearing on 12/8/2021 the Board of Zoning Appeals;

VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TO GRANT A SPECIAL PERMIT under Weymouth Zoning Ordinance Section 120-40 and 120.22.8 A (2) — To repurpose an existing commercial building for use for the storage and distribution of computer parts with no structural change to the building.

FINDINGS:

The Board found that the proposal met the requirements for a Special Permit under Section 120-122 (D) as follows:

- 1. The specific site is an appropriate location for such a use. The building has previously been used for more intensive commercial uses and is located on a major commercial roadway.
- 2. The proposed use or structure will not be detrimental or adversely affect the character or future character of the neighborhood or town. No structural change to the building is proposed. All activity will be conducted within the existing structure. The building is currently vacant. The hours of operation will not create a nuisance for adjacent residential neighborhoods.

- 3. There is not a potential for nuisance or serious hazard to vehicles or pedestrians. *Adequate parking exists on site.*
- 4. There are adequate and appropriate facilities, utilities and other public services provided for the proper operation of the proposed use. *All work will be done in conformance with Town of Weymouth Building Code*.
- 5. That the public convenience and welfare will be substantially served with the proposal. The building has been vacant for several years. This proposal will bring a new commercial business to Weymouth and provide additional tax revenue. The proposed use will not negatively impact surrounding residential development.

CONDITIONS:

- 1. Remove freestanding pole sign. Replace with ground mounted sign and enhance landscaping with landscaping plan approved by the Director of Planning and Community Development prior to installation.
- 2. Replace glass windows in the front with new glass windows
- 3. Paint entire building exterior
- 4. Replace fence along rear property line. New fence will be opaque to maximize abutter privacy. Fencing to be approved by the Director of Planning and Community Development.
- 5. Remove small section of chain link fence along the Washington Street frontage
- 6. All lighting to be directed downward. No wall packs allowed
- 7. Any dumpster on the property will be fully screened.

Under MGL Chapter 40A, Section 11, the approval of the Board of Zoning Appeals will NOT take effect until it has been recorded in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds.

After the twenty (20) day appeal period has passed, the Town Clerk will send to the petitioner: (1) the certificate that no appeal was filed, (2) the certificate of granting of variance and/or special permit. The petitioner shall record these documents with the Norfolk Registry of Deeds, Dedham, MA, with the appropriate filing fee.

When a receipt from the Registry of Deeds is presented to the Building Inspector (to show that the decision has been recorded), the proper permit will be issued.
