

Weymouth Resident Weekly Update # 4

February 5, 2021

Since our last weekly report, the following has occurred:

1. Resident Representative

Amy Kabilian has assumed the position of Resident Representative for Oversight. I had a call with Amy and brought her up to date on the 611 project status. I welcome Amy and her further involvement in this process.

2. Billboard Product Selection

As reported before, the Town has to approve the vendor to supply the actual sight line blocking boards. As of today, the Town is still processing information provided directly to the Town by the two vendors. When the Town makes the selection, Cove will order the signs.

3. Status of 611 Tree Cutting with Weymouth Conservation Commission. The Weymouth Conservation Commission has received the Metrovision draft of the Order of Conditions & Mediation. Metrovision awaits for a response and approval from the Conservation Commission in order to move forward with MA DOT for the tree cutting permit.

4. Status of 611 Tree Cutting MA DOT Requirements.

As reported before, MA DOT is seeking "public input" on the proposed tree cutting plan. I am attaching a power point presentation again for your review. This shows what trees will be removed. If you want to input, please email me and your comments will be filed with the MA DOT.

The Town has to provide a letter of support for the tree cutting to be filed with MA DOT. As of today, Metrovision has not received the letter. Without the letter and other items mentioned herein, Metrovision cannot file the application with DOT.

5. Century Road Neighborhood Tree/Shrub/Fence Issue.

We have received several calls regarding plantings at homes of some residents who are impacted by the billboard. It is our intention to proceed with the tree cutting/sign lowering at 611 with the installed light blocking technology to determine which neighbors will be in need of additional plantings as mitigation to the visibility of the sign. This assessment will be made after the work is complete. If anyone is aggrieved and should have plantings, this will be conducted in the spring and after the sign is lowered.
