

Mayor Hedlund is excited to share the Town of Weymouth has been awarded a \$336,000 “Safe Streets For All (SS4A)” grant from the US Department of Transportation. The SS4A program grants go directly to regional, local, and Tribal communities for implementation, planning, and demonstration projects driven at the local level to improve safety and help prevent deaths and serious injuries on the nation’s roadways. These funds will help tackle the preventable crisis of deaths on the nation’s roads through safer people, roads, and vehicles, appropriate vehicle speeds, and improved post-crash care.

The first phase of this grant funding entails creating a “Vision Zero Action Plan” by community members, town staff and Town Council. Vision Zero is a strategy to eliminate traffic fatalities and severe injuries among all road users, and to ensure safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all.

We are looking for interested resident volunteers, one from each district of Town, to assist the Town in developing plans, projects and strategies to help us achieve Vision Zero.
