Regulation #10 Combination Gasoline Service Stations and Food Service/Retail Food Establishments

The Board of Health of the Town of Weymouth, Massachusetts, acting under the authority of the General Laws, Chapter III, Section 31, and in accordance therewith and in the interest and preservation of public health, hereby adopts Board of Health Regulation #10, governing the establishment of a combination gasoline/ service stations and food service/retail food establishments.

- 1. Devices used for the dispensing of gasoline, kerosene and any other petroleum product shall be a minimum of seventy-five feet from that portion of the locus used for the storage, preparation, handling and dispensing of food and/or food related product.
- 2. No person handling the devices used for the dispensing of gasoline, kerosene and all other petroleum products shall be allowed to handle any food or food related product.
- 3. Separate shelter from that used by personnel engaged in the handling of food/ food related items shall be provided for personnel handling the devices used for the dispensing of gasoline, kerosene and all other petroleum products.
- 4. Separate storage from that used for food/food related items shall be provided for all items pertaining to the support and operation of the gasoline/service station portion of the locus.
- 5. Unless otherwise specified in this regulation all provisions listed in Article X of the State Sanitary Code (Minimum Sanitation Standards for Food Service Establishments) and all provisions listed in the Division of Food and Drug Rules and

Regulations Relative to Retail Food Establishments promulgated under authority of Chapter 94, Section 305A, of the General Laws, as amended, shall be in force.

- 6. No food service/retail food/milk and cream license shall be issued to any person, firm or corporation until completion of all portions of this Regulation have been adhered to and verified by the Weymouth Board of Health or its authorized agent.
- 7. If any article, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Regulation shall be declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, that decision shall not affect any other portion of the regulation which shall remain in full force and effect.

This regulation was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Board of Health on February 24, 1977.
