**Weymouth Health Department
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**Regulation #7
Additives to Sand for Accelerating Melting Process**

The Board of Health of the Town of Weymouth, Massachusetts, acting under the authority of the Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 111, Section 31, and Chapter 111, Section 167, and in accordance therewith and in the interest of and for the preservation of public health, hereby adopts the following Regulation #7 governing the use of additives to sand for the purpose of accelerating the melting process of ice and snow' on roadways and parking areas of private developments that are located within the Town of Weymouth Watershed Area, and the governing of bimonthly reports of pollution from the runoff from said areas that may be harmful to the drinking water supply of the Town of Weymouth.

1. No person, firm, corporation or developer engaged in sanding of private ways, roadways, parking lots and all other areas whereupon vehicular or pedestrian traffic is permitted, where such locations are within the Town of Weymouth Watershed, may use any additive to sand or gravel for the purpose of accelerating the melting process of ice and/or snow in said areas.
2. The Board of Health, Director of Public Health, or any of his duly authorized representatives, may request on a bi-monthly basis of any person, firm, corporation, or developer a report of pollutants that may be injurious to the drinking water supply of the Town of Weymouth and may be contained in the run-off from any private roadway, parking area and/or all other areas whereupon vehicular and/or pedestrian traffic is allowed. Upon such request of any person, firm, corporation, or developer, at his own expense, shall supply the Board of Health, Director of Public Health, or its duly authorized representative, a copy of the results obtained as a result of testing of water runoff, such testing to be done by a qualified laboratory.
3. Whoever violates any provision of the foregoing regulation or order made thereunder, shall be punished by a fine of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for each occasion such violation occurs.

This regulation was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Board of Health at a regular meeting of the Board of Health held Monday, May 5, 1975, to be effective June 1, 1975.
