2020 Open Space Projects

This project seeks to complete a number of trail and open space projects initiated by the Mayor's Open Space Committee in 2019. In many cases we are creating access to town owned parks and conservation areas that are currently inaccessible to the public. These projects include the Great Pond Trail, Wessagusset historic markers, House Rock Park Trail, Weymouth Landing Canoe Launch, Herring Run Pool Park and Bradford Torrey Bird Sanctuary. Also included is funding to cover the printing cost for the town's first Trails and Open Space Guide. These projects have been planned to be cost effective with the funding requested just to cover material costs associated with these project, all labor associated is provided by DPW and the recreation department. In Several cases outside funding has been leveraged as well. The Projects break down as follows:

Great Pond Trail

This project will open access to a 1.1 mile continuous trail that runs from Gifford Park to Negus Park. The land around Great Pond is currently off limits to public access to protect the Town's Water supply, and only this trail will be opened. The goal here is allow for some passive recreation to occur as well as deter some of the negative uses currently occurring on the land. Funding will cover the cost associated with a small board walk, map design and two trailheads located at Gifford and Negus Parks.

House Rock Park

At house Rock Park we are continuing our work to establish a .34 mile trail through 26 acres of Town owned land behind house Rock Park. The funding here will cover the costs of a small stream crossing, map design and a trailhead. This project was started last spring with help from a summer inter.

Wessagusset Historic Markers

The Wessagusset Historic Woodlot was purchased by the town in 1999 with CPC funds. This project will establish a three part interpretive panel telling the history of the first settlement at this location in 1622. This project has been proposed by the Weymouth Historic Commission and coordinated by the Open Space Committee and will include input from the Massachusett people. All of the information will be provided by local historian Mark Schneider. Other site improvements will include a new picnic table, trailhead and site map, and landscaping improvements.

Landing Canoe Launch

We have recently made significant improvements to the landing canoe launch, including new guardrail and benches. The goal here was to create a more park like space for landing residents by delineating parking, creating more green space and providing benches. Previous conditions allowed for abuse of the site and was rarely utilized by the public. We were able to leverage state funds to cover the cost associated with the guardrail, with DPW assisting with installation. Funding here would cover the cost of an interpretive panel giving visitors some contextual information on the history and ecology of the Fore River.

Trail Guides

Lastly, funding will cover the cost associated with printing the Town's first trail and open space guide. This guide will include maps and info for all of the Town's noteworthy trails and open space, including info on our natural resources and boating access.
