When to Contact the Conservation Commission

If you believe you are with 100 feet of a wetland or 200 feet of any constantly flowing river, stream, or creek or just want to make sure and:

1. When you plan to do any landscaping, dig a hole, fill a hole.

2. When you plan to cut a bush, tree, plant a bush or tree or change the vegetation surrounding your home in any way.

- 3. When you plan to put an addition on your house, add a pool or side buildings.
- 4. When you plan to pave what is now a gravel driveway.
- 5. When you plan to install a new driveway.
- 6. When you plan to alter a stream or stream bed.
- 7. When you plan to do anything about that nasty puddle of water in your yard.
- 8. When you plan to move a wall or install one.
- 9. Before you buy a house.

Or:

10. When you're wondering what that NO WORK BEYOND THIS POINT sign means

11. When you're wondering what **DEP** followed by a lot of numbers on a sign means

12. When you recently bought a house and are wondering what the restrictions about not building within 25 feet of a wetlands mean.

13. When you plan to use Conservation Land for any event.

14. When you would like to organize a "*Friends of…*" group to help in the maintenance or preservation of Conservation Land.

15. When you see someone chopping down vegetation on a coastal bank, river bank, or in a wetland.

16. When there is a man from a vehicle with the seal of the Town of Weymouth on its door, standing in the street looking at that nice hole you just dug and shaking his head.
