Old Business:

- Civil War Monument Schneider; Weymouth 400 is planning a ceremony May 12 to
 commemorate the 150th anniversary off the original dedication. It was agreed that the WHC, the
 GAR, and Weymouth 400 Program Committee will meet soon to propose the details. The
 Commission will continue to monitor and encourage physical improvements to the Monument
 Grounds in North Weymouth Cemetery by the Town.
- Weymouth 400 Schneider; The Weymouth 400 Committee has made progress on incorporation, initial funding by sponsors, branding, web design, and social media outreach. In 2018, the Committee will focus on Civil War related lectures and events.
- 4 Mutton Lane Walker; The Conservation Commission approved preservation of the house with a historically appropriate exterior.
- 4. Emery Estate Torrey; The Town is working to develop the park area, but no decision has been made by the Mayor re preserving the building. Commissioners should contact the Mayor's office to encourage its preservation
- 5. Historic District signs Walker; The Commission will encourage the Town to mark Historic Districts, such as Meeting House and Beals Park, with appropriate signage.

New Business

Canoe Preservation – Walker. The Commission Chairman should stay in contact with the Library regarding proper care of the Canoe, now in the Library's custody.

Torrey moved to accept November minutes, Murphy second, approved.
