
### TOWN'S OBJECTIVE FOR COLUMBIAN SQUARE

To create a more livable, safe and vibrant Square for all its users and that meets the needs of the stakeholders.


#### PROJECT PROCESS

#### **COLUMBIAN SQUARE – The Study Area**








#### ASSESSING EXISTING CONDITIONS

- Physical features
- Complete Streets assessment
- Traffic Flow characteristics
- Safety Characteristics/Road Safety Audit
- Observed parking conditions

#### PHYSICAL CONDITIONS

- Parking, median landscaping restricts sight distance
- Geometry encourages high speeds around curves
- Long pedestrian crossing distances, without refuge islands
- Historic area
- Excessive pavement area
- Long pedestrian crossings
- Deteriorated non-ADA-compliant Sidewalks





### TRAFFIC FLOW CONDITIONS


- Pleasant Street is a high volume (21,000 vehicles per day)
- Approach speeds at Square >30 mph
- Long queues
- Numerous conflict points and disorder

#### SAFETY EXPERIENCE

- Total reported 73 crashes at Square between 2013 and 2015
- 4% injury related crashes
- Between 2011 and 2015, 6 reported pedestrian crashes
- 14 parking-related crashes (2013-2015)
- HSIP crash cluster for 2015-2017 period
- Since 2017, 4 more pedestrian related crashes and 20 related to parking maneuvers

#### SAFETY EXPERIENCE

#### Pedestrian's Chance of Death by Vehicle Speed



- High travel speeds
- Visibility constraints
- Parking maneuvering
- Long, unprotected pedestrian crossings
- Poor lighting for pedestrians
- Road Safety Audit confirmed a number of safety issues

- Lots of opportunities






#### **IMPROVEMENT PLAN**

- It is critical that safety issues are addressed
- The Improvement Plan must take a Complete Streets approach and be consistent with town policy
- The Plan must offer realistic, reasonable and achievable actions
- The Plan must balance the various needs of users and stakeholders in the public right of way



# ACTIONS TAKEN BY TOWN SINCE 2017

- Chauncy Street converted to one-way
- Installed angle parking on Chauncy
- Reduced speed limit through Square
- Installed speed feedback display signs
- Added pavement markings at main intersection
- Mayor's office sought and obtained grant funds to supplement local funds to initiate engineering design
- Preliminary engineering plans completed in late 2020
- Final design initiated in September 2021



- Improved signage including RRFBs
- Curb extensions & refuge islands

#### PARKING IMPROVEMENTS




Improve awareness of & guidance to off-street parking lot

- Create a uniform character




### CREATING SPACES FOR PEOPLE

- Consider aesthetics for pedestrians and drivers













#### WEST ALLEY - CONCEPT PLAN



#### EAST ALLEY - CONCEPT PLAN






### TRAFFIC MAINTENANCE PLANNING

Construction will be phased to minimize impacts to traffic, pedestrian access and business owners























### TRAFFIC MAINTENANCE PLANNING

- Periods of sidewalk closure will be necessary.
- Ongoing coordination between the contractor and abutters will be performed to limit access disruption.



# TRAFFIC MAINTENANCE PLANNING

Periods of Night work will be utilized to mitigate high impact construction phases.

- Utility Work
- Paving
- Pavement Markings

### CONSTRUCTION PERIOD CONDITIONS


- Construction: Summer 2022 Spring 2024
- Temporary one-way-alternating traffic during the day
- Temporary full closure with detour at night
- Police and Flaggers for Traffic Control
