Explore the neighborhood


Fire insurance maps and atlases show entire communities as they were in the past, including businesses, private homes, public places, apartment buildings and government offices.


Imagine what life was like

INTERACTIVE MAP SEARCH

Use the Interactive Map search function to identify potential map coverage at a precise location.

Search by entering an address, lat/long, or name of the location of interest. Or simply click on the map to set a marker at the property of interest.

PLACE NAME SEARCH

Use Place Name search to find map publications for a city, county, or other place in the drop down list for a selected state.

Place names include current and historical names for cities and towns, neighborhoods, unincorporated villages or other populated areas.

INTERACTIVE MAP SEARCH

STEP 1: **GENERATE PUBLICATION LIST**

Use the Interactive Map search function to identify potential map coverage at a precise location.


Enter an address or a lat/long coordinate, then click Go.

or

Navigate and zoom to the property of interest and click on the map to set a marker.

STEP 2: CHOOSE A MAP SHEET


- **2A** Click on the "Show" button to turn on the Index Map for a specific publication.
- **2B** Locate the Map Sheet number for the specific publication for your property of interest
- **2C** Click on the name of the Publication

PLACE NAME MAP SEARCH

STEP 1: GENERATE PUBLICATION LIST

Use Place Name search to find map publications for a city, county, or other place in the selected state.

- Choose the State from the drop-down menu.
- Choose the Place Name from the second drop-down menu.






STEP 2: CHOOSE A MAP SHEET

- **2A** Click on the Publication of interest to open the publication.
- **2B** Click on the Text Index or Index Map to identify which map sheets depict an area of interest.

STEP 3: READ AND WORK WITH MAPS

- **3A** Click on map sheet found in STEP 2.
- **3B** Read the Map with the aid of Research Tools
- **3C** Mark up the map using the Drawing Tools.
- Temporarily save the map by clicking on its check-box and refer back to it in "My Project Folder" for quick reference (folder will be cleared upon logout).
- **3E** Create PDF (to save or print) and download full resolution Jpegs (if available).
- **3F** Go back to Search Results to view other map publications.
- **36** Start Over to complete a new search.
