BORROWING FOR COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE REPLACING THE RALPH TALBOT PRIMARY SCHOOL'S BOILER SYSTEM

Upon request of his Honor, Mayor Hedlund, the Town of Weymouth, through the Weymouth Town Council approved the following:

ORDERED: that the Town appropriates the amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for the purpose of paying costs of the complete removal and replacement of the Ralph Talbot Primary School's original boiler system located at 277 Ralph Talbot Street, South Weymouth, Massachusetts 02190, which proposed repair project would materially extend the useful life of the school and preserve an asset that otherwise is capable of supporting the required educational program, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Town of Weymouth Construction Steering Committee, and to meet said appropriation of the Town of Weymouth's Chief Financial Officer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow said sum under M.G.L Chapter 44, or any other enabling authority, and that the Town of Weymouth acknowledges that the Massachusetts School Building Authority ("MSBA") grant program is a non-entitlement. discretionary program based on need, as determined by the MSBA, and any Project costs the Town of Weymouth incurs in excess of any grant approved by and received from the MSBA shall be the sole responsibility of the Town of Weymouth; provided that any grant that the Town of Weymouth may receive from the MSBA for the Project shall not exceed the lesser of (1) Fifty Six point Two Six Percent (56.26%) of eligible, approved Project costs, as determined by the MSBA, or (2) the total grant amount determined by the MSBA; and that the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to this vote shall be reduced by any grant amount set forth in the Project Funding Agreement that may be executed between the Town of Weymouth and the MSBA.

Any premium received upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this order, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this order in accordance with M.G.L. c. 44, ss20. thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount."

Nor is it intended to be a final determination of which budget, cost and scope items may be eligible for 1. The estimated maximum racilities grant established for the Project Funding Agreement does not include any potentially eligible contingency tunds and is subject to review and audit by the MSBA. At the time of PFA Bid Amendment, the Estimated Maximum Facilities Grant and the Maximum Total Facilities Grant will be adjusted to account for any budget revision requests submitted and approved by the MSBA at the time of establishing the
