"FURTHER ORDERED, That the sum of \$2,000,000.00 is appropriated to pay costs associated with the construction, installation and furnishing of seven (7) permanent modular classrooms at the Frederick C. Murphy Primary School, 419 Front Street, Weymouth, May 02188; the Ralph Talbot Primary School, 277 Ralph Talbot St, Weymouth, MA 02190, and the Academy Avenue Primary School, 94 Academy Ave., Weymouth, MA 02190, and for the payment of all other costs incidental and related thereto, and that to meet this appropriation, the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to Chapter 44 of the General Laws, or pursuant to any other enabling authority, and that the Mayor is authorized to contract for and expend any grants and, or gifts available for this project; and that the Mayor is authorized to take any other action necessary or convenient to carry out this project.

Any premium received upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this vote, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this vote in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 44,

Section 20, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount."

The order must be published at least ten (10) days prior to final passage, and notice of the public hearing on the loan order must be published not less than seven (7) days nor more than fourteen (14) days prior to such public hearing. The loan order requires at least a two-thirds vote, as in the case of any other loan order for bonds.
