Description:

Improvements at Beals Park in North Weymouth keep with Mayor Hedlund's vision, commitment and investment in Weymouth's parks and playgrounds.

Background

Beals Park is a neighborhood park nestled between Sea Street, Athens Street and Bridge Street (RT 3A). The Town's recently updated Open Space & Recreation Plan recommends enhancing Beal's Park for its green spaces adjacent to the RT 3A corridor and its proximity to Bicknell Square. Currently, an inventory of the grounds is limited to some off-street parking, a basketball court and play equipment. The topography of the site offers a popular venue for sledding during the winter months.

In September of 2021, the Town hired Activitas Inc. of Dedham, MA, (\$27.000) for park planning, sound analysis and thoughtful design options, including:

- Public process with interactive input
- Analysis of site constraints and opportunities
- Public presentation of conceptual design alternatives with cost estimates

The goals of the project include enhanced opportunities for play and passive recreation while revitalizing and preserving public open space for future generations to enjoy.

The Town and Activitas hosted 6 public meetings over a 15-month period. Additionally, Activitas met with Town staff several times during this same time frame. In December of 2022, after receiving public input and feedback via the meetings, emails and survey materials, Activitas presented the attached preferred conceptual design for Beals Park. The design may be viewed on the Town's website as follows: https://activitas.com/beals-park-weymouth-ma/

In June of 2022, the Town hired Activitas (\$325,000) for complete engineering and design services. This contract includes plans and specifications for bidding and construction oversight through final completion of the project. The timeframe for construction is April, 2023 through September, 2023. The cost is estimated at \$2.6M. The Town plans to go out to bid in February with a bid opening at the beginning of March.

New park elements include gateway points with signage and lighting at Athens Street, Bridge Street and Sea Street. The Bridge Street entrance includes a gazebo, plaza area, interpretive panels and seating. Other amenities include a skatepark, half basketball court, play structures for kids, a pickle ball court and walking paths. The hill used for sledding remains in the new plan. The existing parking lot will be expanded on Sea Street and the parking lot on Athens Street will be re-built while staying approximately the same size as it is today. At the end of the project, Activitas will provide a maintenance plan for the park and the Town will maintain it.

This request, in the amount of \$400,000, is for the Town's direct procurement for the supply of the playground equipment and gazebo proposed in the plans for the restoration of Beals Park. Childscapes of Marshfield is an approved playground contractor on the Commonwealth's official state contractor list. The Commonwealth's Operational Services Division procures contracts and encourages municipalities to use the list for a variety of supplies and services. This procurement will be administered through the Town's Procurement Division. When bidding the project, interested bidders will be instructed to install the equipment purchased from Childscapes by the Town. The supply of the equipment only is covered under this request. The installation of the equipment is covered under another appropriation for the restoration of Beals Park.
