PROJECT NARRATIVE

PROJECT NARRATIVE

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The applicant is proposing to conduct selective tree cutting within the layout of State Route 3 opposite 609 and 611 Pleasant Street in Weymouth, Massachusetts (See Section III, Figures 1 and 2). The purpose of the tree cutting is to improve the line of sight from the southbound lane of State Route 3 through to an existing billboard located within the property at 611 Pleasant Street. The billboard is in the process of being lowered by approximately 25 feet to decrease its visibility from residents to the west of State Route 3. All of the proposed work associated with the project will occur within areas subject to protection under the MA Wetlands Protection Act (M.G.L. Ch. 131 § 40) ("Act") and the Weymouth Wetlands Protection Bylaw ("Bylaw"). The vegetation management areas are located within a bordering vegetated wetland ("BVW"), its associated 100-foot buffer zone and the buffer zone associated with an unnamed intermittent stream.

2.0 EXISTING CONDITIONS

The site where the proposed activity will occur is located within the roadway layout between Pleasant Street and State Route 3 (See Section III, Figures 1 and 2). There is an existing billboard located within an upland area within the property located at 611 Pleasant Street. The State Route 3 layout extends to the north and south. The work area is bordered to the west by the northbound travel lane associated with State Route 3 and to the east by Pleasant Street and commercial / industrial development.

The portion of the highway layout where the work is proposed consists of a combination of forested upland and bordering vegetated wetland. The forested uplands are dominated by a vegetation community comprised of red oak (*Quercus rubra*), white oak (*Quercus alba*), American beech (*Fagus grandifolia*), black cherry (*Prunus serotina*), and Norway maple (*Acer platanoides*) in the overstory with an understory containing sweet pepperbush (*Clethra alnifolia*), multiflora rose (*Rosa multiflora*), common greenbriar (*Silax rotundifolia*), phragmites (*Phragmites australis*), bracken fern (*Pteridium aquilinum*) and fox grape (*Vitis labrusca*).

Review of the current Massachusetts Natural Heritage datalayers on MassGIS indicates that there are no estimated habitats of rare wildlife or certified vernal pools within the proposed project location (See Section III, Figure 3). According to FEMA, the site is not located within the 100-year floodplain (MA GIS 2021) (See Section III, Figure 4).

3.0 WETLAND RESOURCE AREAS

In January 2021, a South River Environmental ("SRE") wetland scientist delineated the boundary of the BVW within the property. The wetland delineation was conducted in accordance with the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act and the Weymouth Wetlands Protection Bylaw.

3.1 Bordering Vegetated Wetland

There is one BVW system that extends south to north within the roadway layout that is associated with an intermittent stream. The system is classified as a palustrine forested wetland dominated by trees greater than 20 feet in height. The wetland boundary was delineated within the area where the tree cutting is proposed to occur. The wetland and intermittent stream both extend further to the north parallel to Pleasant Street.

The delineated wetland boundary commences along the western edge of Pleasant Street approximately 150 to 200 feet north of 609 Pleasant Street. The boundary extends to the south along and parallel to Pleasant Street turning to the west at an existing culvert extending under Pleasant Street and the access to number 611 Pleasant Street. The wetland extends further west adjacent to a ledge outcrop and then turns back to the north where it extends parallel to Route 3 North to a terminus at a second culvert that conveys drainage from the highway into the intermittent stream. The wetland boundary was delineated with pink survey flags labeled WF-1 through WF-50.

The overstory vegetation within the wetland is dominated by red maple (*Acer rubrum*), gray birch (*Betula populifolia*) and American elm (*Ulmus americana*). While there are some larger diameter trees within the wetland, the majority of the stems are in the sapling stage and approximately two to six inches in diameter. Highbush blueberry (*Vaccinium corymbosum*), sweet pepperbush (*Clethra alnifolia*), silky dogwood (*Cornus amomum*), speckled alder (*Alnus rugosa*) and northern arrowwood (*Viburnum dentatum*) comprised the most prevalent shrub species. Common greenbriar (*Smilax rotundifolia*), cinnamon fern (*Osmunda cinnamomea*), phragmites and soft rush (*Juncus effuses*) were all dominant in the vine / herbaceous layers. Soils within the wetland were characterized by muck, saturated to within two to four inches of the surface in most areas and contained both mottles and oxidized rhizopheres. Aside from the flowing water present within the intermittent stream, there was no standing water present within the BVW at the time of the field delineation.

3.2 Inland Bank / Riverfront Area

An intermittent stream, which is not depicted on the USGS topographic quadrangle map (See Section III, Figure 1), enters the road layout from the east through a pipe that extends under Pleasant Street. The stream flows through the BVW parallel to State Route 3 and Pleasant

Street and continues further to the North. The stream is approximately three to five feet in width and has defined banks on both sides. The mean annual high-water line associated with is coincident with the first observable break in slope. The individual banks were not physically delineated in the field as they are located wholly within the associated BVW.

4.0 PROPOSED ACTIVITIES

The applicant is proposing to conduct selective tree cutting within the BVW and its associated 100-foot buffer zone. The proposed activities will consist of the following:

- Preliminary marking of the trees to be cut will be completed a minimum of 72 hours prior to the start of work using colored survey flagging.
- Tree removal will be limited and will consist mainly of white pines. Based on the
 existing tree heights, the trunks will be cut a minimum of 5 feet from existing ground
 level unless leaving the remainder of the trunk would pose a safety risk;
- All tree cutting work will be conducted and/or overseen by a licensed arborist;
- All trees cut will be removed from the BVW or buffer zone unless the Commission would prefer to use it to enhance wildlife habitat;
- No vehicles or equipment will be allowed within the BVW. Vehicles (cranes, etc.) will be staged as necessary within the existing paved area associated with Pleasant Street:
- No refueling of equipment (chain saws or equivalent) will be allowed within the BVW and will be conducted within the paved area associated with Pleasant Street;
- No vegetation will be cut until the marked trees / saplings have been reviewed by the Conservation Agent or designee;

Figure 1 - USGS Topographic Map Opposite 609 & 611 Pleasant Street




Figure 1 - Aerial Locus Map Opposite 609 & 611 Pleasant Street





Figure 4 - Floodplain Map Opposite 609 & 611 Pleasant Street






