## Weymouth's Bridge Street Focus of Upcoming Community Workshop and Survey

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Weymouth, MA – This past fall, Mayor Hedlund announced that the Town of Weymouth was awarded a Housing Choice Grant in the amount of \$100,000 to provide funding related to a planning and zoning study for the Bridge Street /Route 3A corridor.

The scope of work for this project includes; a review of previous plans, reports and data, a market assessment, demographic profile, inventory of existing land uses and conditions along the corridor including Bicknell Square, as well as looking at transportation from the point of view of safety, access, parking and multi-modal and how route 3A can better function as a neighborhood connector. Also, a zoning analysis will be conducted with recommendations for new zoning.

An important part of this process for developing a plan for this corridor is having a robust, inclusive community engagement process. One element of this engagement is two Community Workshops.

The Town of Weymouth is hosting the first Community Workshop on the Bridge Street corridor and Bicknell Square area on Thursday, March 21 in the Weymouth Senior Center Gym at 182 Green Street at 6:30 pm. The Town of Weymouth is inviting neighborhood residents and the general public to participate in an interactive workshop on the future of the Bridge Street Corridor and Bicknell Square.
