INVITATION FOR BIDS

FY18 Complete Street Improvements

The Town of Weymouth, as Awarding Authority, invites the submission of sealed bids for construction of various Complete Streets improvements at various locations in the community. **To be eligible to bid, contractors must be approved by the MassDOT Highway Division's prequalification process.** Improvements include but may not be limited to bituminous concrete sidewalk, cement concrete sidewalk, cement concrete wheelchair ramp construction, new granite curb, removing and resetting curb, cement concrete pads, installing bus shelters, installing bicycle parking racks and erecting shelters for the racks, loam and seeding, pavement markings, new traffic signs, removing and resetting signage onto new posts, new speed feedback display signs, new rectangular rapid flash beacons, and other incidentals.

Bid documents may be obtained electronically beginning Wednesday, October 11, 2017 at 12:00 p.m. Requests for electronic files may be sent to Nicholas Bulens, Administrative Services Coordinator, Town of Weymouth at nbulens@weymouth.ma.us.

BIDS ARE DUE on Tuesday, November 14, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. at the Town of Weymouth's Department of Planning and Community Development, 75 Middle Street 3rd Floor, Weymouth, Massachusetts 02189, and will be opened immediately thereafter in the Third Floor Conference Room, 75 Middle Street 3rd Floor, Weymouth, Massachusetts 02189.

All sealed proposals must be delivered to the Town of Weymouth prior to the bid opening, as stated above, at which time and place they will be opened and read aloud. Bidders assume the risk of any delay due to mail delivery. Proposals received after the bid due date and time will be returned unopened.

This project is funded through the MassDOT's Complete Streets Funding Program. The Town of Weymouth reserves the right to waive any informalities in bids, to reject any or all bids, or to accept any proposal that in their judgment will be in the best interest of the Town.
