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## **NOTICE: VALOR ACT II**

### *Waiver of Initial License & Application Fees for Active Military, Veterans, and Relocated Spouses*

The Division of Professional Licensure (DPL) is pleased to announce that under new legislation signed into law by Governor Patrick, beginning July 3, 2014 initial license and application fees will be waived for active duty military service members, veterans, and relocated military spouses who are entitled to benefits under the original VALOR Act.

The new law, known as VALOR Act II, follows in the footsteps of the original VALOR Act (Veterans' Allowances, Labor, Outreach, and Recognition). Under the original VALOR Act, signed into law by Governor Patrick in 2012, DPL and its 31 professional licensing boards provided the following benefits:

- The acceptance of relevant education, training, and service completed by an applicant for licensure while a member of the armed forces or the military reserves toward the qualifications required for licensure, by each of DPL's boards;
- The extension of license expiration dates for members of the armed forces who are on active duty while their license expires, allowing the license to remain valid until he or she is released from active duty, and for 90 days thereafter; and
- The expedited approval of licensing applications for military spouses who are licensed in other states and have left employment there to accompany a spouse relocated to the Commonwealth due to a military transfer.

Now, under VALOR Act II, the Commonwealth's portion of the initial licensure and application fee is being waived for those who qualify for the original VALOR Act benefits. Applicants are advised that they may still be required to pay fees charged by private vendors who assist DPL in processing license applications.
