**Harbormaster Report:**

Lt. Morse of the newly created Marine Unit, introduced himself and said that he will be overseeing harbormaster duties, in an administrative capacity, following the passing of the late Harbormaster, Paul Milone. He reported that:

- People are getting used to the new on-line Mooring Permit software
- Islands have been removed to make for easier boat trailer access

**Beach Walkway Update:**

Mr. Luongo said there wasn't much to report.

Chairman Mutch said they will be looking at the Seaport Economic Grant first, and then will look into other sources of funding.

Mr. Luongo said they are continuing to work with the Building Dept. on the permitting for stairs down the embankment (provided there is no revetment).

Ms. O'Leary suggested they could look into CPC (Community Preservation Committee) money.

Mr. Luongo said he thinks there is time to get a funding application in before the May 1, 2021 deadline.

**Lane Beach Boat Ramp:**

Mr. Luongo said they are waiting to hear from Coastal Engineering about what will be needed for the dredging project, along with a cost estimate.

*Mr. Luongo left the meeting at 5:30pm.*

Chairman Mutch said Fort Point Road is not shovel ready. He said they are going into final design, and they need funding.

**Seawall update (Johnson and Wessagusset):**

**Discussion:**

Chairman Mutch asked where the town should focus after the Fort Point Road project is completed.

Mr. Geary suggested the Johnson Beach area, 172 – 226 Wessagussett Road.
