Scope and Contents: A modest number of books found in the Fifield cabinets in the study room and related to the anti-slavery movement were removed and now comprise a small artificial collection. Books are arranged by author's last name and include *Autobiography of Harriet Martineau with Memorials by Maria Weston Chapman*, 1877; and *History of Pennsylvania Hall*, 1838. Pennsylvania Hall in Philadelphia was destroyed by anti-black rioters at the time the Anti-Slavery Convention of Women was meeting there. Maria Weston Chapman was one of the noted speakers. A review of the ground floor stacks uncovered similar books and the Library may wish to develop a collection of such books in the future.

Contents of the single records storage box also include: a first edition of Henry David Thoreau's *Walden; or, Life in the Woods* belonging to the WCT001 Fifield Family Collection; and several anti-slavery books from WCT010 Fogg Library Records and Collection.
