**Biographical / historical note:** Emily Anna Porter (1838 -1913), daughter of Thomas Bradstow and Emily Vining Porter, married William Bond Cranch Fifield (1830-1896), son of Dr. Noah and Hannah Cranch Bond Fifield in 1856.

Porter at the age of 15 was sent to Boston to attend a school run by William B. Fowle. William Bentley Fowle (1795 -1865) wrote numerous school texts. Upon her graduation, Porter returned home and married her long-time beau. The couple lived in Dorchester but maintained close ties to Weymouth.

They are described in a Dorchester Athenaeum biographical sketch as having cultivated refined instincts. They were both fond of music and attended the Symphony and other concerts and oratories in Boston. Dr. Fifield played the violin.

Emily Fifield was a long time member of the Boston School Committee, first elected in 1884 and at that time only the second woman, She was known for her philanthropic, religious, and educational work. She served as Recording Secretary of the National Alliance, a national woman's organization of the Unitarian Church and wrote a history of the Alliance completed by her daughter. In 1911 she and her daughter and son-in-law had a house built in Milton named Kingfield.

Mary Fifield King (1857-1941) was the only daughter of William Cranch Bond and Emily Anna Porter Fifield. There is no information about her education. She married Sylvanus F. Freeman in 1875 according to *A Genealogy of the Descendant of Richard Porter who Settled in Weymouth*, 1635 and allied families by Joseph Whitcomb Porter, 1878 (Bangor: Burr and Robinson, printers) on Google books. Then, sometime before 1911, she married Henry B. King. No information about her two husbands has been found. She completed her mother's history of the National Alliance, prepared historical scrapbooks for the First Church Dorchester and donated Fifield family historical materials to the church and the Boston Medical Library as well as to Tufts Library.

**Scope and Contents:** The collection has two series: I) Sheet Music; and II) Bound Volumes of Music. The sheet music, almost all of which is stamped Fifield Collection, was either owned or collected by the Fifield family, in most cases Emily A. Porter Fifield and her daughter Mary Fifield King.

Series I. Sheet music, 1828 - 1877, n.d., six 12 x 15 inch drop front boxes, 2.5 li. ft..

This series is arranged alphabetically by title of the song or composition. The container list gives the title, composer, lyricist, publisher and place, lithographer, artist of cover illustrations, date, and a description. The sheet music includes popular dance and concert music as well as songs. Of particular interest is the abolitionist, political, and Civil War songs. Noted artists and composers are represented. The cover lithographs on some sheet music, including a few in color, also are of interest. Found attached to a few pieces were lithographs of several notable individuals. They have been left with the music except in one instance where the lithograph was loose and bore no relationship to the music.

Series II. Bound volume music series, 1831- 1853, 7 volumes in two 9 x 11 drop front boxes, 1 li. ft. This series includes church music as well as volumes of music for children, for adult singing schools or parties, for temperance meetings, and cotillions. One volume is entitled "The Boston Handel and Haydn Society Collection of Church Music".

Mary Fifield King wrote a lengthy article appearing in the 1916 Sept 22 issue of the *Weymouth Gazette and Transcript* (see WCT014 Newspaper Collection) that describes the donation of about forty pieces of music popular in Weymouth between 1840 and 1860 as well as some of the hymn books. She notes many artists, songs, and illustrations. The actual number in the collection is 102; there is no information in the Library annual reports about when Fifield King augmented the original donation.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> From Library of Congress description. Song dedicated to antislavery editor Nathaniel Peabody Rogers; illustrated with an allegory of the triumph of abolitionism. In a landscape a railroad car, "Immediate Emancipation," is drawn by a locomotive named "Liberator" and followed by another locomotive, the "Repealer," which pulls a second car "Liberty Votes and Ballot Boxes." "Liberator" refers to W.L. Garrison newspaper. "Repealer" probably refers to the Irish insurgent movement in support of the repeal of the Legislative Union, a cause with which many abolitionists in the United States were allied. Flags bearing the names of two other abolitionist publications, the "Herald of Freedom" and "American Standard" (i.e., Rogers's" National Anti-slavery Standard), fly from the "Emancipation" car. In the distance two other trains, one marked "Van" and the other "Clay," crash and their passengers flee. These allude to Democrat and Whig presidential hopefuls Martin Van Buren and Henry Clay. Reference to Van Buren suggests that the music-sheet appeared before the Democratic convention in May, when James K. Polk, not Van Buren, received the party's presidential nomination.
